On the **BASIC > Services** page, you can configure caching for HTTP, HTTPS, and Instant SSL services and their content rules. In the **Caching** section of the virtual service or content rule settings, you can:

- Enable and disable caching.
- Specify the response file extensions that can be cached.
- Specify the maximum and minimum object size for caching.
- Specify whether to ignore request headers, response headers, and negative responses
- Enter the default cached object expiration age.
