Onsite Managers and Device Managers are designed for different purposes. This table illustrates the differences between them and when you should use each:

	<b>Onsite Manager</b>	<b>Device Manager</b>
Is designed for Networks	X	
Is designed for single roaming devices and environments that don't have a server or peer-to-peer networks		X
Manages both Windows and Mac	X	
Is OS-specific (Choose Windows or Mac)		X
Communicates directly with Service Center	X	X
Requires an additional MS SQL Server Express instance	X	
Can be configured to communicate to Service Center through a proxy	X
