

## ArchiveOne Service Account Permissions

The [ArchiveOne Service Account](#) is used by the ArchiveOne Service and ArchiveOne Admin console to connect to Microsoft Exchange. Note that this account must have a mailbox. During installation, the ArchiveOne service account and ArchiveOne users security group are created, however, under certain circumstances, you must manually create the service account.

## ArchiveOne Service Account Requirements

The following table lists account requirements:

Requirement	Details
Mail-Enabled NT User in the same domain as Microsoft Exchange	The default account created by the installation is called <b>ArchiveOneAdmin</b> .
Microsoft Exchange rights	You must have <i>Send As</i> and <i>Receive As</i> rights as well as <i>Administer Store</i> on Mail and Public Folder Stores. The ArchiveOneUsers group must have <i>Full Access</i> permissions on the service account's mailbox.
Member of the local Administrators' security group on the ArchiveOne and Microsoft Exchange servers	
Full Control Share and NTFS security permissions on the Add-ins shared folder	Located on the ArchiveOne server.
Full Control NTFS security permissions over the location where the ArchiveOne repositories are to be stored.	
<i>Logon As Service</i> rights on the ArchiveOne server.
