If you are using IIS 6.0, there are a few additional steps you must take to configure the web server running Service Center, to ensure that the service module functions as expected.

Configuring IIS 6.0 (Virtual Directory)

- 1. Open Internet Information Services (IIS) Manager.
- 2. Expand the Web Sites folder.
- 3. Expand the Default Web Site folder.
- 4. Right-click the Service Center site, and select Properties.
- 5. Click the Virtual Directory tab.
- 6. Click Configuration.
- 7. Click Insert.
- 8. In the Executable field, type c:\windows\microsoft.net\framework\v4.0.30319\aspnet isapi.dll.
- 9. Clear the Verify that file exists check box.
- 10. Click OK.

Configuring IIS 6.0 (Website)

- 1. Open Internet Information Services (IIS) Manager.
- 2. Expand the Web Sites folder.
- 3. Right-click the Service Center site, and select Properties.
- 4. Click the Home Directory tab.
- 5. Click Configuration.
- 6. Click Insert.
- 7. In the Executable field, type c:\windows\microsoft.net\framework\v4.0.30319\aspnet_isapi.dll.
- 8. Clear the Verify that file exists check box.
- 9. Click OK.

Modifying the Web Configuration File

- 1. Go to C:\Program Files\Level Platforms\Service Center\SC.
- Open web.config.xml using Notepad.
- 3. Between the httpHandlers tags, add the following:

path="ServiceModules/Download/*"verb="*"type="SC.ServiceModules.Handlers.Down
