
For Windows devices, users can install VPN templates on their computer by clicking the VPN provisioning link in the **Settings** section of the desktop portal.


Before You Begin

Self-Service VPN Provisioning on Microsoft Windows

- 1. Log into the SSL VPN web portal.
- 2. Click the menu in the upper left-hand corner and click **Settings**.





5. Verify that you are opening the VPN template with the Barracuda NAC Remote Management
