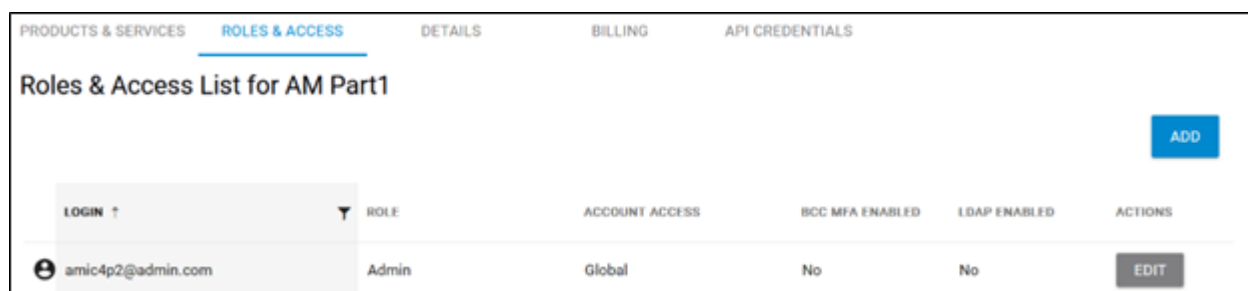

- Actions



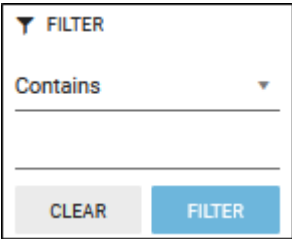

The Role column can be filtered.

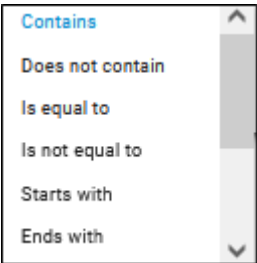
Clicking the Role filter icon displays the following options:

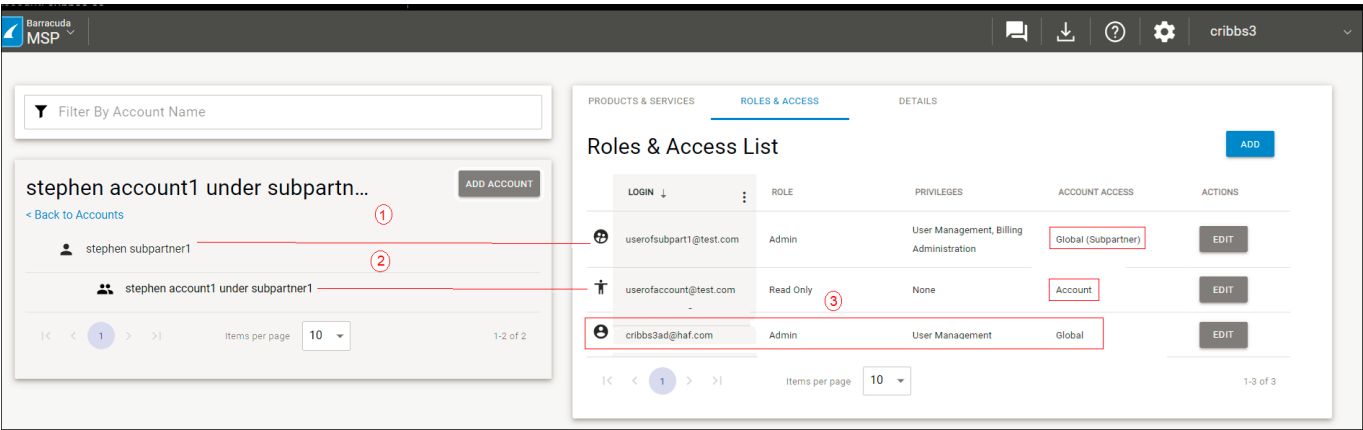

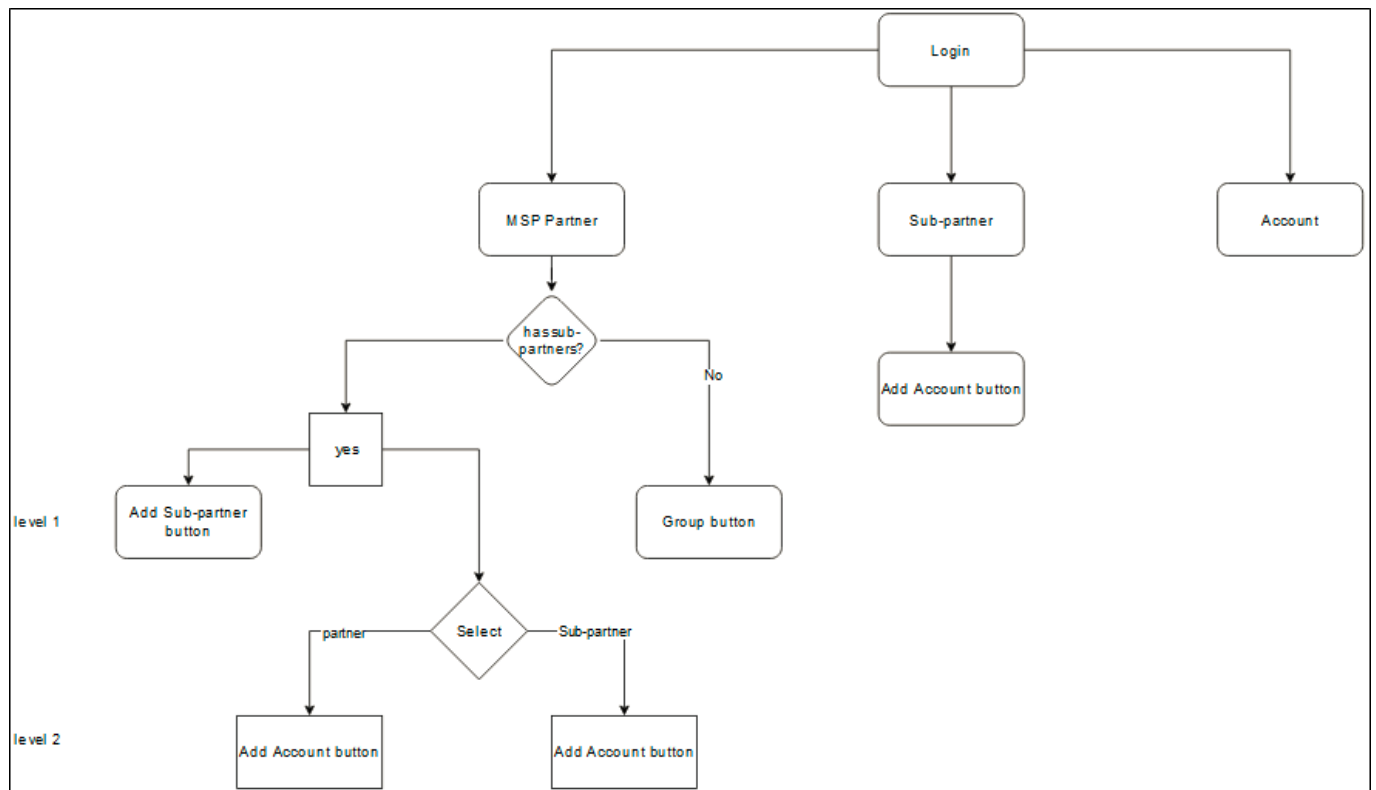
Example (1) displays *stephen subpartner1* with an Admin role that provides Global (subpartner) access.
