


Introduction to Events, Alerts, and Alarms

Events, Alerts, and Alarms are different statistics used in Barracuda XDR. It's useful to understand the difference between the three terms.



An **Event** is a single, observable item in a monitored data source such as a packet or token, aka the "raw data".

An **Alert** is an **Alarm** that has been escalated to a customer/MSP.

An **Alarm** is a pattern of activity that implies a potential risk. An alarm could indicate an identified threat to an information system, violate acceptable use policies, or the circumvention of standard security practices.
